Who: All Scout Troops & Venture Crews!

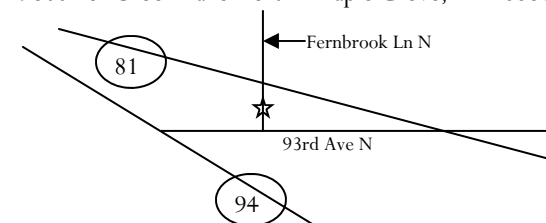
What: Leadership training for all skill levels from Basic YLT to Advanced College for Scouts who have been through NYLT Grey Wolf and Venture Crews.
