Webelos and Webelos Leaders are welcome to join us Saturday May 2<sup>nd</sup> 2009. Allow extra time for parking and arrival on Saturday. Check-in will begin at 7am with opening flag at 9am.

Northern Lights & Mustang Districts: You are responsible for bringing your own lunch for Saturday afternoon. Saturday evening dinner with the troops will be provided.

Lake Minnetonka District: You have a choice to connect with a troop for Lunch and Dinner; otherwise you are responsible for bringing your own lunch and dinner.



Boy Scout handbook


### **Preparation:**


- 1. You have all day to build and test. Must be ready for competition by 5pm


Sample Diagram:
