Rum River Scout Camp At Colbert Lodge


Saturday, January 22nd at 9:00 am

Yukon Territory some 3300 miles to the northwest is where the last big gold rush took place. The year was 1898 when thousands of men and women sought their fortune in the hills near Dawson in the Yukon. The route to the gold fields was over snow covered mountains pulling their sleds with 500# of supplies.

The Derby will be a round robin of 6 events of challenges and winter skil Patrol sled is your ticket to win the most ribbons for your Troop.

Klondike Sled Requirements 2011

Each patrol will be judged for having all the required items on its sled.


•	Troop ID	Compass	An Official sled equipment LIST!!
•	First Aid Kit	Pencil and Paper	Fire Building Materials/Bundle of Firewood
•	25 ft of Rope	Tarp	Pocket Knife for Each Scout
•	Patrol ID	Water Container	Snow Snakes enough for each patrol
•	Pair of Flip Flops	Blanket/Sleeping Bag	* Swimwear

What to bring on the sled for the Klondike Derby.

The sled is hand made by the Scouts. The size is a minimum of 16" wide and 4 to 7 feet in length. See attached sample directions.

Also good Scout spirit, completing the course and a good race time. Dogs pulling the sled must have one rider and driver. All must cross the finish line. Sleds must be guided and cannot be carried at any time. Fire building materials will also be needed for the other skill event, so you might be hauling two bundles of firewood during the sled race. Drink plenty after the race. Patrol Leaders: PLAN YOUR DAY!

For an extra \$9.00, you can spend camp with other Troops sharing a campfire, and working together building your winter shelter. No equipment will be furnished, make sure you bring everything you will need for the Klondike Derby. You'll be treated to a crackerbarrel, night skill game, and get breakfast served up by the one and only Joe Sears. At the end of the Klondike you'll receive an Ice Man Patch. What do you need

You will need one adult leader for every 5 Scouts, bring your own mess kit and support equipment. You will need to bring an extra pair of clothes and a lunch for Saturday. Along with everything else you need to bring the Scout Roster of the Scouts attending and make one check to cover the fees of all youth and adults attending.

Do I need to Help

You will be camping along with other Troops, so please leave your site clean, keep the group site clean, and help in any group functions. Must have your gear packed up and be ready for Klondike by 8:45 am.

How to get ready

BSA Field Book, OKPIK: Cold Weather Camping. Scouts plan how you will build your shelter for that night when it's dark. Make your equipment list, assign duties, review the plan to cover all aspects of winter weather, and how does it go together when you are setting up camp in the dark. Bring water for Friday night and staff will furnish more.

Safety First

Use the Buddy System. The lodge is open if you get cold. Just have an adult bring you there.

The making of the snow snake is a great inexpensive troop activity.






Figure 2 hours from start to finish per snake. One 2 X 4 makes 2 snakes. Lay out the snakes head to tail with a paper pattern.



Rough out the snakes with a saw, (adult leader can help in the ripping of the long body). Once the snakes are roughed out, they can be detailed by carving, filing and finally the painting.
