Please consider attending the University of Scouting. This one-day event truly has something for everyone. We are confident you will have a great time and come away from this event with new ideas and resources to deliver the Scouting program.

If you are new to Scouting or in a new leadership position, the University is an excellent opportunity at which to obtain your position-specific training. You may want to take This is Scouting and Youth Protection along with your position specific training.

The University of Scouting provides you the opportunity to choose from over 125 course offerings in six colleges.

Like any University, you build your own schedule when you register. For example, if you are involved with Cub Scouts, first look to the Cub Scout College, then the General College for course offerings. But as Cubs grow up to become Boy Scouts, you may want to look for ideas in that college too! A Vendor Midway will be open all day with tons of scouting related stuff to see, do, or buy. Even the Scout Shop will be there with supplies and materials.

Tuition is the same no matter how many courses you choose, but I'm guessing you will have a hard time limiting classes to a full day of 6 or 7. A couple of classes may have an additional fee to cover material costs, and those are listed in the course catalog. Taking a full day of classes (6 hours) leaves you an hour for lunch.

Lunch is included with your registration fee and is catered Subway® sandwiches, chips, beverage and a cookie. Please let us know of any special dietary concerns and we will attempt to accommodate them. Scouts from a local unit will be offering coffee, donuts, treats and other goodies for purchase throughout the day. Choose one of the available lunch periods in your schedule.
